GENERAL REGULATIONS

Subject to the rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Associations Inc, and the Association relevant to this schedule, the following General Regulations apply.

GENERAL REGULATIONS AND ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

- 1 *Judging will be performed by a Judge or panel of Judges appointed by the Proserpine A.P. & I. Association Inc.*
- 2 *The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc. and the Proserpine A.P & I. Association Inc, in addition to the Special Regulations which appear in this schedule. Copies of the Rules and By-Laws may be obtained upon application to the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies.*
- 3 *No refunds will be made after close of entry*

NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS

4. *Entries for the upcoming Proserpine A.P.& I Association Inc's Show, (Show Whitsunday) can be made as described for each section in this schedule. Entries submitted other than on the correct form or online will be returned to the Exhibitor and, unless all requirements are complied with, and the forms are returned to the Proserpine A P & I Association Inc.'s office by completion of business on the closing date, as shown in this Schedule, they will not be considered.*
5. *Notwithstanding the provisions of General Regulation 4, late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Section Chief Steward.*
6. *Entries are accepted subject to the Rules,By-Laws and Regulations of the Association, in addition to any Special Regulations, which appear in this Schedule.*
7. *Exhibitors whose entries have not been accepted shall be advised accordingly and entry fees refunded.*
8. *The Exhibitor irrevocably consents to the Association publishing or reproducing in any manner whatsoever any particulars or information in relation to their exhibits; the publication or reproduction may be in a printed form or visual image through electronic means and/or on the internet.*

PRIVACY STATEMENT

9. *The information provided by Exhibitors is used by the Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc and the Proserpine A.P. & I. Association Inc to organize, process and conduct competitions at Show Whitsunday. By entering such competitions you consent to your personal information being used for this purpose including this information being made available to sponsors, breed Associations, the media, the public, promotional purposes, archival purposes, published in publications and could be made to other third parties for the purpose of promoting the Queensland Agricultural Show Movement, or as otherwise required by law. Exhibitors have a right of access to and alteration of personal information concerning themselves in terms of the Privacy Act. This may be done by contacting the QCAS Chief Executive Officer or by writing to the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc.*

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

10. *A "No Smoking Policy" will be strictly adhered to by Exhibitors / Competitors and Exhibitors/ Competitors are advised that the use of Primus stoves, any heating or lighting appliances of like character, or any naked light, is strictly prohibited in pavilions.*
11. *Any Exhibitors/Competitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Proserpine Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with residual current protection and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected by a licensed electrical contractor and currently tagged. **THE USE OF DOUBLE ADAPTORS IS PROHIBITED.** All power boards must also be tested and tagged.*
12. *All exhibitors/competitors will comply with the requirements of the Act and its Regulations and Standards in every other respect. This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors/ competitors and the general public. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions. Any exhibitors/competitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Associations Inc affiliated shows.*

13. *The information contained in the Competitions Schedule is gathered for the purpose of providing information to Exhibitors and show patrons. The information is a compilation of information provided by third parties and the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Associations Inc and affiliated Agricultural Associations does not warrant its accuracy and advises that any such information may be subject to change or amendment occurring at any time and thereby making the information incorrect. Subject to the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Associations Inc. legal obligations and responsibilities, if you require confirmation of any information please contact the QCAS Office.*

PRIZES AND GST

14. *The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise.*
15. *The information an Exhibitor provides on the Application for entry determines whether GST is applicable.*
16. *Any prize stated in this schedule does not include GST*
17. *GST will not apply:*
- (a) If an exhibitor enters an exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or*
 - (b) If an exhibitor enters an exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN, but the EXHIBITOR is NOT REGISTERED for GST.*
 - (c) If an Exhibitor enters an exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia.*
18. *GST will apply if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the Exhibitor has an ABN and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.*
19. *Where GST applies, the Association will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus 10% GST. The Association will issue a recipient created tax invoice.*

3. Exhibitors may go onto a list awaiting availability of stables. Stables will be allocated on a first in first serve basis.
4. The Proserpine Agricultural, Pastoral & Industrial Assoc Inc. will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage or mis-delivery of livestock or other exhibits at "Show Whitsunday".
All exhibitors should be aware that the show includes a variety of entertainment and events, such as fireworks, motor bike exhibitions, camel rides etc. which may cause a disturbance to your animals. The exhibitor is reminded that they are responsible for taking the necessary steps to ensure the safety of their animals throughout the duration of the show. Exhibitors are also reminded that they will be held liable for any damage caused by their animals to property or person throughout the duration of their stay on the grounds belonging to the Proserpine Agricultural, Pastoral & Industrial Assoc Inc.
5. Any person who willfully injures or destroys any property within the grounds or hinders or obstructs the officers or servants of the Association will be prosecuted and dealt with as the law directs.

6. Exhibitors of livestock for competition must at the time of entry state the age, breed etc and produce the relevant pedigree if required.
7. No exhibit will be admitted to the competition without the ticket issued by the Ring Stewards for that purpose. Tickets will not be issued unless all gate entry, camping and stables fees are paid in full and indemnity form is signed and held by the show office or the steward.
8. All protests must be lodged with the Secretary accompanied by a deposit of **\$50.00** within 2 hours of the notification of the judges' award. If a protest is considered frivolous by the committee, the deposit shall be forfeited.
9. Any prize money not collected by **Saturday 18th June 2022** will be considered a donation to the Assoc.
10. Special prizes shall be gladly accepted for any class not enumerated in this schedule.

11. Definitions

LOCAL - Yalboroo to Greta Creek

To be owned and ridden by person resident for 6 months immediately prior to the show

DISTRICT - 160km radius of the Proserpine Post Office. Shall be a horse and rider combination that have permanently resided within a radius of 160km from Proserpine Post Office for the last 6 months

MAIDEN - Please see new regulations further in this schedule.

NOVICE - Please see new regulations further in this schedule

PONY - Under 14 hands

GALLOWAY - 14 to 15 hands

HACK - Over 15 hands

FILLIES & COLTS - 3 years and under

All entries must be made before the show by the competitor/exhibitor simply by purchasing a ticket for each class in which he/she wishes to compete. These tickets will be available at the show office in bulk prior to competing. Exhibitors may also pick up their tickets on Thursday 17th June or after 7:00am on Friday 19th June

PLEASE NOTE: TICKETS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE TO ANY COMPETITOR UNTIL OUTSTANDING CAMPING, STABLE FEES AND SHOW GATE ENTRY ARE PAID IN FULL AND INDEMNITY FORM IS COMPLETED AND SIGNED. RING STEWARDS WILL HAVE A COPY OF ALL PAYMENTS MADE AT THE SHOW OFFICE PRIOR TO JUDGING.

When the class is called into the ring, the ticket must be passed to the steward. **NO TICKET – NO ENTRY**

12. **PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY** shall take place at the completion of each event. Payment shall be made by stewards.
13. The jumping events at the 2022 "Show Whitsunday"
AGE DEFINITION:
18 years and over - SENIOR
Under 18 years - JUNIOR

14. Owners/Exhibitors/Competitors must be in control of their animals at all times

15. **On the Friday & Saturday of the show, lunchtime ring entertainment will be scheduled for a time nominated by the Proserpine A P & I Assoc Inc committee. All ring events will cease for this entertainment.**

16. **CONDITIONS**

- a) All nominations must be paid before horse will be allowed to start an event
- b) Horses will be judged class after class as per catalogue however, class order may be varied at steward's discretion.
- c) Horses and exhibitors/competitors appearing in the ring to be judged with any prize ribbon or any distinguishing badge on will be disqualified
- d) Any colt or stallion two(2) years or over must be led with a bit, chain and bar and an adequately strong headstall
- e) Stallions are not eligible in Hack or Riding classes unless otherwise stated.
- f) Ponies, Galloways and horses can compete in their classes only
- g) In all jumping classes, riders must wear skull caps and shall be suitably attired
- h) The use of any whip with a lash by exhibitor or attendant during any class is prohibited
- i) First place getters in individual events are eligible to compete for Champion and Reserve in each division, unless otherwise indicated in the program
- j) The Grand Champion will be judged from the Champion in each open division
- k) Winners of DISTRICT classes are eligible for champion in their individual height classes

VERY IMPORTANT NOTICE

Payment of camping fees does not imply that there will definitely be power outlets for campers.

Exhibitors are reminded that they may use power cords at the rate of one (1) only per power outlet.

Any exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Proserpine Showgrounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged currently by a licensed electrical contractor.

This is essential for the safety of all exhibitors and the general public and is a requirement of the Workplace Health and Safety Act of 1989. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provisions.

Any exhibitors who do not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at Show Whitsunday run by the Proserpine A. P. & I. Association Inc.

No person may be engaged in electrical work of any kind, for which he/she does NOT have the relevant qualifications, technical knowledge and necessary experience.

ALL ELECTRICAL FAULTS MUST BE REPORTED TO THE SHOW OFFICE IMMEDIATELY AND THE PROSERPINE A. P. & I. ASSOCIATION INC.'S APPOINTED ELECTRICIANS WILL ATTEND TO THE MATTER AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

THE PROSERPINE A.P.& I.ASSOC RESERVES THE RIGHT TO PROVIDE DONATED TROPHIES OR PRODUCT INSTEAD OF CASH PRIZES

SPECIAL HORSE REGULATIONS

These regulations are to be read in conjunction with the General Regulations contained in this schedule.

1. NOTICE TO INTENDING EXHIBITORS

- 1.1 **A MAIDEN** has not won in competition at an affiliated agricultural Show. After winning a **MAIDEN** hack class this horse will be recognised as a **NOVICE**. A Novice will remain a **NOVICE** until winning an open championship at an affiliated agricultural show.
- 1.2 **Parents, Guardians, or strappers are NOT PERMITTED in the horse arena during judging other than in any lead line class as in accordance with regulation 1.4 herein.**
- 1.3 A marshalling area is provided by Proserpine A P & I Association and there will be marshalls at the gate to the horse arena. All exhibitors and patrons **MUST** follow the marshall's directions.
- 1.4 In any lead line class only one (1) handler may be involved in the leading of the Pony, Galloway or Hack.
- 1.5 The President or Committee person will have the power to turn out any horse and rider from the ring, in any class, if they deem it is not entered correctly, or give permission for it to enter the correct class.
- 1.6 At any affiliated agricultural show, the horse committee has the right to substitute a judge.
- 1.7 Once judging of a class has commenced the Steward has the right to refuse entry to the class for competitors who are late.

- 1.8 In breed classes, registration papers (where applicable) must be available at the Show as proof of registration and carried on the person when actually competing and presenting the horse. (Photocopies, preferably coloured, are acceptable).

- 1.9 Any Exhibitor who by themselves or any agent who:

- a) directly or indirectly presents a horse which has an identity other than its true identity;
- b) does any act or thing which is likely to result in a horse being incorrectly identified; Is automatically disqualified from exhibiting.

2. JUDGING

- 2.1 In the event of the Judge deciding that the exhibits in any Class are not worthy of a prize, no prize will be awarded.
- 2.2 Judging books shall be completed by the steward and Judge during or immediately after the judging of the section or at the Judge's convenience. Records shall be updated by the Secretary's office each evening after events are completed.
- 2.3 An Exhibitor shall not compete in a section if the Exhibitor is a member of the Judge's immediate family.
- 2.4 A Judge or Steward must not knowingly permit an ineligible Exhibit or Exhibitor to compete.
- 2.5 **NO** Exhibitor or members of the immediate family or employed by the Exhibitor shall approach a Judge with regard to a decision made by the Judge unless they first obtain permission from a Committee person.
- 2.6 An Exhibitor shall not compete nor show any animal in a section if the animal; has been owned or leased by the Judge or a member of the Judge's immediate family within six (6) months prior to the show or if the Judge is the Exhibitor's employer or business partner.
- 2.7 An Exhibitor shall not compete if the Exhibitor or any animal being shown by the Exhibitor has been given tuition by the Judge or the Judge's business partner within three (3) months prior to or during the show.
- 2.8 An Exhibitor is ineligible to compete, if the Exhibitor has employed or has been employed by or has been a business partner of the Judge of the Section within three (3) months prior to or during the holding of the show.

2.9 A Judge shall not visit the livestock- housing complex of the Agricultural Society, nor the owners, nor inspect or discuss any animal entered in the Show prior to or during judging of the relevant section.

2.10 In Breed Classes, ALL animals must have current Registration and Ownership Certificates with the Breed Society.

3. HEIGHT OF EXHIBITS

3.1 Pony Hacks must not exceed 14 hands

3.2 A Galloway Hack shall be over 14 hands and not exceeding 15 hands

4. PONY HACKS

4.1 Show Pony Hack and Show :Pony Hunter Hack over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 14 hands may be ridden by a juvenile or adult.

4.2 All small Pony Hacks and Show Hunter Hacks 12.2 hands (127.5cm) and under to be ridden by a juvenile under 17 years of age.

4.3 Horses may be entered in Hack classes OR Hunter Hack classes but not both

5. AGE AND COMPETENCE OF COMPETITORS

5.1 A person who has not attained the age of six (6) years must not ride a horse at a show unaccompanied by an adult.

5.2 A person who has not attained the age of eighteen (18) years must not ride or handle a Stallion at a show.

5.3 An Honorary Steward may at any time require a person who does not appear to be able to ride or handle any horse to dismount and leave the ring.

5.4 The age of the person is determined as at the first day of any affiliated show.

5.5 A person who has attained the age of twelve (12) years may ride in the Open Hack Ring.

5.6 Proof of age must be presented when requested by the steward and is to be carried on the person whilst competing or exhibiting unless such proof has been presented to the show administration prior to acceptance of entries or judging of the section.

6. WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

6.1 It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to ensure that the leaders of their horses in judging rings and exercise areas are capable of exercising control over the animals in their care.

6.2 Each exhibitor/competitor will assess the risk to themselves, staff, volunteers, family other exhibitors, show stewards, show visitors and any person foreseeably affected by the presentation of their exhibit.

6.3 The exhibitor/competitors are required to ensure that they and all persons under their direction or control comply with all requirements of the current Workplace Health and Safety Act, and the Affiliated Show Society holds each exhibitor responsible to discharge its obligations to provide and maintain a safe place and system of work during occupation by the exhibitor/competitor of any area of the Showgrounds.

6.4 Energised electric fences must have permission from the Show Society and will be restricted to the marked area on the grounds map. NO FENCES WILL BE ALLOWED OUTSIDE THIS AREA. All fences are to be suitably signed.

7. AGE OF HORSES

7.1 The age of all horses to be calculated as at 1 August. Every horse foaled before 1 August in any year shall be deemed to be one (1) year old on that date.

7.2 Male horses under the age of three (3) years are defined as being Colts and female horses under the age of three (3) years are defined as being Fillies.

8. DRESS REQUIREMENTS AND EQUIPMENT

8.1 All riders and attendants must be neatly and appropriately attired whilst in the main arena and/or judging ring. The Chief Steward has the right to exclude anyone from competing whose attire is inappropriate.

8.2 Shorts, singlets, thongs, joggers and similar attire are not permitted.

8.3 Judges and Stewards in all horse rings must be suitably attired.

8.4 Any rider competing in events at an affiliated agricultural show must wear protective headgear to the current Australian Standard (unless otherwise stated in the schedule for the class). The retaining harness must be secured and fastened at all times. Riders without approved headgear shall be ineligible to compete until rectified; if request is ignored instant elimination from all events will occur.

- 8.5 Recommended wear for informal classes; Safety Skull Cap (to the current Australian European or American Standard), shirt and tie, coat, jodhpurs, elastic sided boots, riding cane, gloves, tweed coat.

9. CONDUCT IN MAIN ARENA

- 9.1 Whilst in the main arena of any affiliated show's event, exhibitors and competitors will be under the direction of the Chief Steward and the stewards in charge of the respective judging rings.
- 9.2 The society accepts no responsibility if judging times conflict with one or more classes or events in which an exhibitor may be entered. Where a conflict may occur, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify a withdrawal from either event. No ring shall be required to wait for a competitor or exhibitor who may be competing in another ring.

10. CRUELTY - EXCESSIVE USE OF WHIPS & SPURS

- 10.1 The excessive use of whips or spurs by any rider in any event or on the grounds will not be countenanced. Any person continuing the practice after being warned may be debarred from competing further in any event. Cruelty to horses is forbidden at any affiliated show event.
- 10.2 Any competitor found guilty of committing a definite act of cruelty will be disqualified from taking part in all competitions of the event where the offence has been committed.
- 10.3 **NO SPURS WITH SPIKES WILL BE PERMITTED.**
- 10.4 The Chief Steward shall be the sole judge of what constitutes cruelty and includes without limitation:
- a) to whip or beat a horse excessively;
 - b) to subject a horse to any kind of electric shock;
 - c) to use spurs, or to jab the horse in the mouth with the bit, excessively or persistently;
 - d) to rap a horse;
 - e) to remount, or attempt to remount, an exhausted, lame or injured horse;
 - f) to hypersensitise any part of a horse
 - g) to leave a horse without adequate feed drink or exercise;
 - h) excessive exercise

11. STALLIONS

- 11.1 Stallions are not permitted to compete in hack classes
- 11.2 All stallions and colts must be correctly bitted whilst in hand and the Judge/Ring Steward in charge shall have the right to disqualify any exhibit, if in that Judge/Ring Stewards opinion, such exhibit is not able to sufficiently be controlled in a safe manner for judging to continue. The exhibit will be ineligible to compete in the class in which it is entered or paraded and upon such disqualification the exhibit shall forthwith be removed from the judging ring.
- 11.3 At no time can a stallion be handled by a person under eighteen (18) years of age.
- 11.4 A stallion with only one descended testicle is a Monorchid, whilst a stallion with no descended testicles is a Cryptorchid and both are classed as unsound in stallion classes.

12. PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

- 12.1 A person must not administer a prohibited substance or cause one to be administered to any exhibit except as permitted by any By-Laws or Regulations.
- 12.2 The exhibitor, owner and attendant of any exhibit to which a prohibited substance has been administered is in breach of the By-Laws unless the prohibited substance is permitted by the By-Laws or Regulations to be administered.
- 12.3 An exhibit to which a prohibitive substance has been administered in breach of the By-Laws must be removed from the judging ring upon demand of the affiliated show society.
- 12.4 The affiliated Agricultural Society, in its discretion and at any time, may cause an examination to be made of an exhibit, by a Veterinary Surgeon who, in the course of such examination, may:
- * take such samples (including, without limitation, urine, blood, saliva and faeces) from such exhibit as he considers necessary or advisable;
 - * have such samples tested by such methods and procedures as she/he considers appropriate;
 - * examine the Exhibit for desensitised limbs;

- 12.5 Procedures in the above rule are at the expense of the exhibitor/owner of the exhibit in question.
- 12.6 Any Exhibit, Exhibitor, Owner or person in charge of any Animal who appears to have had/have given a prohibited substance will definitely be debarred by the Stewards from competing in any event for which it may have been entered at the Affiliated Show, as all are deemed to have acted in breach of this By-Law. If a Veterinary surgeon is required all expenses for same are the responsibility of the Exhibitor, Owner or Person in Charge.
- 12.7 The Affiliated Society and any Steward or Agent of the Society shall not be liable to any Exhibitor for the death of, or for injury, damage or infection which may be sustained by his/her exhibit occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission of any Steward or Agent of the Society during the course of the testing of the Exhibit, whether due to the negligence of any such Steward, Agent or otherwise.
- 12.8 'Prohibited Substance' means any substance originating externally to an animal (and whether or not endogenous to the animal) capable of affecting the performance of the animal by its action upon:
- * the central or peripheral nervous system;
 - * the cardiovascular system
 - * the respiratory system
 - * the alimentary digestive system
 - * the musculo-skeletal system
 - * the urogenital system
 - * the endocrine system
- AND INCLUDES WITHOUT LIMITATION
- * Analgesics
 - * Anti-histamines
 - * Anti-inflammatory agents
 - * Blood Anti-coagulants
 - * Diuretics
 - * Hormones and their synthetic counterparts
 - * Cortico-steroids
 - * Anabolic Steroids
 - * Local Anaesthetics
 - * Muscle Relaxants
 - * Tranquillisers
 - * Antibiotics
 - * Stimulants
 - * Glues and Bleaches
- 12.9 The administering of antibiotics may be permitted provided the exhibitor can produce a treatment notification form, or a veterinary certificate.

13 BIOSECURITY FOR HORSES

- 13.1 Horse Exhibitors must present; Horse Health Declaration, Waybill and/or Queensland Travel Permit when moving onto any affiliated agricultural society showgrounds.
- 13.2 It is compulsory to complete a Horse Health Declaration for ALL horse entering an affiliated agricultural society showgrounds.
- 13.3 All QCAS affiliated agricultural societies have a comprehensive Agricultural Show Biosecurity Plan and all event organisers, competitors and spectators have a joint responsibility to ensure the successful implementation of a biosecurity plan.
